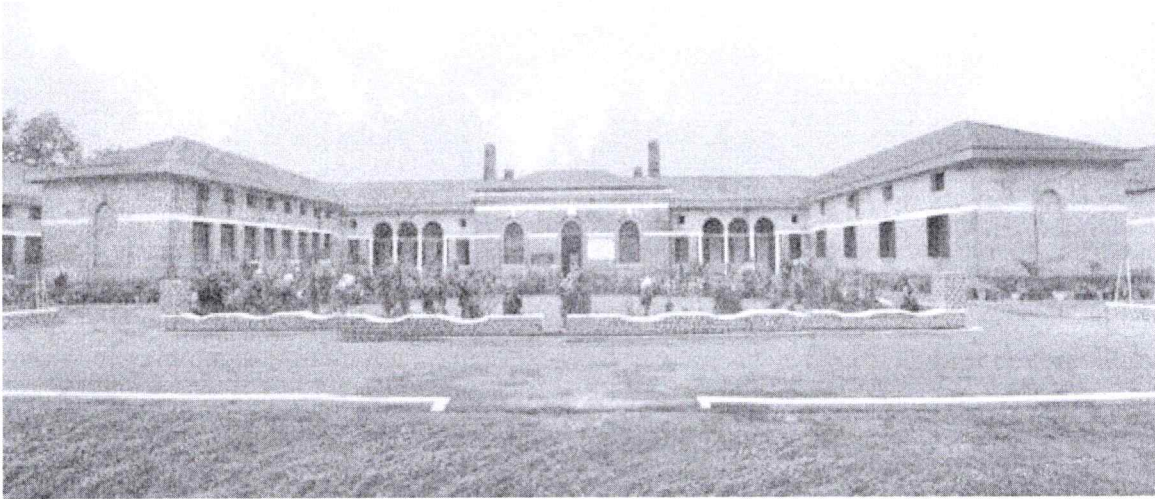

Two days specialised training on

“Role of Judiciary in Forest and Wildlife” for

Judges/ Magistrates of District and Subordinate Courts

24th and 25th February 2021



Forests are the major part of an ecosystem. They are an abode to various plants and animals. They maintain environmental balance by inhaling carbon dioxide and regulating rainfall. They provide food and space to animals that help to maintain the ecological balance. About 31% of the earth's surface is covered with forests, but as the modern age arises and gains momentum, the rate at which the Forests are declining is increasing day by day. The Importance of conservation of Forests and Wildlife is the need of the hour without which the existence of mankind is a big question. Even though, Forest and Environment department is mandated with conservation of Forests, Wildlife and Environment, the conservation efforts could maximise only with people's participation. The active role of judiciary is required for strict implementation of Forests and Wildlife laws and safeguarding the Environment for guaranteeing inter-generational

equity and sustainable development for prosperity.

For protection of forest and wildlife of the country, special laws like Indian Forest Act, 1927, Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 and Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 have been notified in India. However, the conviction rate for forest offences and wildlife crimes are low inspite of stringent enactments.

Nevertheless, the Supreme Court of India and High Courts of various states have come to the rescue of forest and wildlife by their judicial activism and supported the forest department by proclaiming landmark judgements like famous Godavarman Case, Lafarge case etc. In addition, the National Green Tribunal also plays a pivotal role in furtherance of conservation of natural resources of the country.

Aim

To sensitize the Judges/Magistrates of District and subordinates Courts (District and Session Judge, Assistant/ Additional Session Judge, Chief Judicial Magistrate, Judicial Magistrate First Class and Judicial Magistrate Second Class) regarding

- Importance of conservation of Forests and Wildlife
- Legal aspects related to Forests and Wildlife
- Role of Judiciary in Nature conservation

Facilitators

- In- House Faculty having experience in Legal matters
- Guest Faculty with expertise in Legal matters related to Forests and Wildlife.

Course Style

- Two-days online training
- Practical inputs by discussions with experienced officers/resource persons involved in Conservation
- Supported & supplemented by audio visuals and reading material

Mode of Delivery

The sessions will be held online through the Microsoft Teams portal with audio-visual aids. The participants will need to make themselves available at a place with a computer/laptop and good internet connectivity. Video conferencing facilities including microphones and cameras should be available which can also be availed through smartphones by the participants.

Participants

The course is designed for Judges/Magistrates of District & subordinates Courts (District and Session Judge, Assistant/ Additional Session Judge, Chief Judicial Magistrate, Judicial Magistrate First Class and Judicial Magistrate Second Class) of different States in India

Duration

The course will be of two days duration commencing at 9.30 am on 24th February 2021 and ending at 5pm on 25th February 2021. There will be four sessions of about 90 minutes each on both the days with two fifteen minutes tea breaks.

Topics to be Covered

The program will cover topics related to Legal issues in Forests and Wildlife.

Some of the key topics to be covered will be

- Legal Issues in Natural Resource Governance
- Insights of Indian Forest Act, 1927 and Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972
- Biological Diversity Act : Implementation Status
- Forests (Conservation) Act, 1980.
- Judicial Activism in Environment Sector
- Supreme court and High Court Judgements related to Forests and Wildlife
